League of Women Voters Greater Rockford 102nd Annual Meeting Minutes from June 1, 2024

Program

President Sue Theden welcomed attendees and acknowledged distinguished guests that were in attendance: former Mayor Doug Scott, City of Rockford, Mayor Tom McNamara, City of Rockford Atty. Nick Meyers, 6th Ward Alderwoman Aprel Prunty, 12th Ward Alderwoman Gina Meeks, and Winnebago County Board Member District 18 Valerie Hanserd. She introduced the City of Rockford 2024 Youth Poet Laureate Trinity Rucker. Trinity recited two (2) poems, "Years and Years" and "Our Time."

Jo Minor introduced our keynote speaker, Natasha Korecki, NBC News Senior National Political Correspondent. She addressed our theme, "Politics in Our Nation: An Insider's Perspective." She spoke of her experience and that of women in journalism today and twenty years ago. Journalism was once revered. Today with social media outlets, the extreme is loud and wants to be heard. She encouraged us all to support local journalism with paid subscriptions. Her experience as a woman journalist has taken her in places where she feared for her life but would do it all again. She fielded questions from the attendees.

Annual Meeting

President Sue Theden called the meeting to order at 10:57 a.m. She requested a motion to adopt the Roberts Rules of Order. Motion made by V.P. Jennifer Blaisdell, seconded by Carol Davies, motion carried. All in favor replied with "Aye," those opposed said "Nay." The ayes have it. Roberts Rules of Order was adopted.

LWVGR Scholarship Coordinator, Janie Wilson-Cook, announced Timberlyn Turner, a 2024 graduate of Auburn High School, as our 2024 recipient of the \$1,000 LWVGR Scholarship. She was unable to attend due to a prior engagement.

Recording Secretary Valerie Hanserd requested a motion to accept the minutes of the 2023 Annual Meeting. Motion made by Rhonda Greer Robinson, seconded by Patty Stadelman, motion carried. All in favor to accept the minutes replied with "Aye," those opposed say "Nay." The ayes have it. Minutes have been accepted.

Treasurer Christina Hiltrop read the financial report. She also asked the members to fill out the card provided to list their

emergency contact number. She requested a motion to approve the 2024-2025 proposed budget. Motion made by Vice-President Jennifer Blaisdell, seconded by Jo Minor, motion carried. All in favor of accepting the 2024-2025 proposed budget replied with "Aye," those opposed said "Nay." The ayes have it. The 2024-2025 Budget has been approved.

President Sue Theden gave her report of the year in the League. During this primary election cycle, the Government Committee hosted several Candidate Meet & Greets. The Education Committee provided democracy lessons to 5th graders, the Gun Violence Prevention Committee hosted two panels on gun violence prevention, the revision of our dues structure will include a sliding scale. In 2025, the National LWV dues structure will be in effect. We have restarted our Health Committee to focus on mental health. With the passing of Voter Services Committee Co-Chair Dee Dee Soderberg, Carol Bailey became the Chair of Voter Services Committee.

Membership Committee Chair Teresa Hill reported 62 renewals by May 21. The total roster is at 134 with 75 present today including one of our 50-year member, Faye Marcus. The newest member added to the 50-Year Club is Dawn Hallsten. She welcomed the young members and encouraged them to engage more young people to join the League. In closing, Teresa asked for volunteers to help at the LWVGR tent after the 4th of July parade and table.

Recognition and Awards: Sue introduced the five nominees that were nominated for the Mildred Berry Award. Carol Bailey, Teresa Hill, Christina Hiltrop, Faye Marcus, and Jo Minor followed by a flower presentation to each of them. She then announced this year's recipient of the Mildred Berry Award to Christina Hiltrop.

Sue called for a motion for adjournment. Motion made by Teresa Hill, seconded by Carol Davies, motion carried.

Proposed Change to LWVGR By-laws

FROM:

Article III – Membership

*Sec. 2 Membership: Voting members: Persons at least age 16 years of age who join the League shall be voting members of LWVGR, LWVIL, and of the LWVUS.

Members who enroll in LWVGR shall pay annual dues to LWVGR as determined by the LWVGR.

Honorary Life Membership shall be granted to any member of the LWVGR who has been a member of the LWVUS for fifty (50) years or more. No further dues will be required and all privileges shall be retained.

All others who join the League shall be associate members.

*Amendment to Conform By-Laws Adopted at LWVUS Convention 2016



Change LWVGR Bylaws TO:

Article III - Membership

Sec. 2. Types of Membership.

1. Voting Members. Persons of at least 16 years of age who join the League shall be voting members of LWVGR, LWVIL, and of the LWVUS. Those who have been members of the League for 50 years or more shall be honorary life members, excused from the payment of dues. Those who are students are defined as individuals enrolled as full or part time with an accredited institution.

2. Associate Members. All others who join the League shall be associate members.

President's Report

As we close another impactful year, I'm pleased to share highlights of what we've accomplished together. Thanks to your passion and dedication, LWVGR has grown stronger, expanded its reach, and made a real difference across Winnebago and Boone Counties.

The League of Women Voters of Greater Rockford is a nonpartisan, grassroots organization defending

democracy and empowering voters through local advocacy, education, and community engagement.

Year in Review

Tremendous Growth

Our membership grew by 30% this year to 178 members—a 53% increase over two years. Special thanks to Membership Chair Teresa Hill and many others for connecting and energizing our membership through gatherings, events, and communication initiatives.

Voter Services Excellence

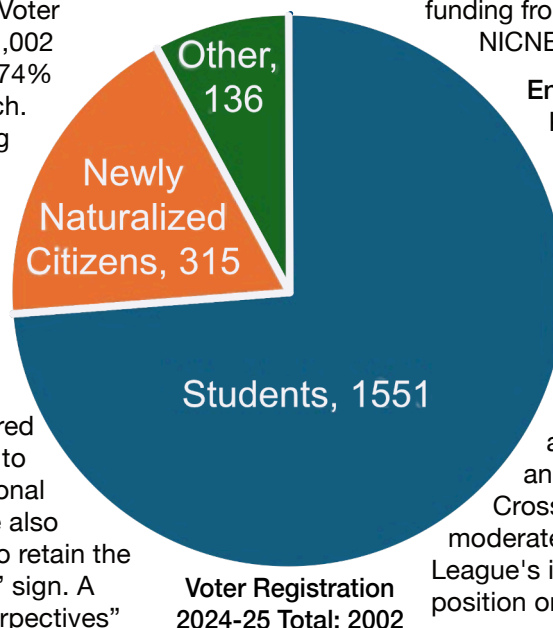
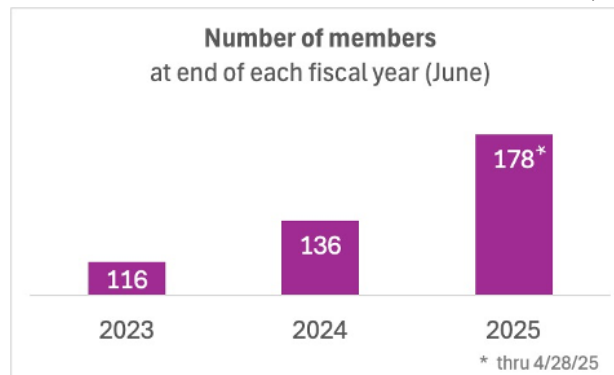
Under Carol Bailey's leadership, our Voter Services Committee has registered 2,002 voters—twice last year's total—with 74% from high school and college outreach. The team hosted 55 events, including the first Stateline High School Voter Registration Challenge and expanded outreach at naturalization ceremonies.

Local Government Engagement

Co-Chairs Terri Schierer and Teresa Hill and their committee hosted ten candidate Meet & Greets and partnered with Go Vote 815 coalition members to combine seven of them with educational forums, drawing 700+ attendees. We also successfully advocated at City Hall to retain the "Rockford - All People Are Welcome" sign. A League member also recorded a "Perspectives" editorial on WNIJ/Northern Public Radio.

Advocacy and Education Highlights

- **Immigration:** As an experienced immigration attorney, and Chair of the Immigration Committee, Sara Dady has brought exceptional leadership and expertise to the LWVGR Immigration Committee during a critical time in our nation's history.
- One major accomplishment was the March 4 "Light 4 Our Democracy" rally at Rockford City Hall, which united 200 League members, local leaders, and community members in a powerful show of support for democracy and immigrant rights. The committee's work significantly raised public awareness and strengthened LWVGR's advocacy presence.
- **Mental Health:** A new joint committee with Eliminate Racism 815, led by Becky Cook Kendall, a retired healthcare executive, and Jennifer Blaisdell, a school psychologist, helped inform voters about the 0.5% mental health sales tax, which passed following a well-attended public forum.
- **Gun Violence Prevention:** New Chair Reverend Danice Loveridge led the committee in a consensus study which led to policy recommendations submitted to LWVIL. The committee also launched a youth gun violence prevention project, backed by \$22,000 in grant funding from the Kjellstrom Family Foundation/NICNE and the Kiwanis Club of Rockford.
- **Environmental Issues:** Chair Patricia Kenney and committee hosted a public forum on water safety and provided ongoing education through monthly tips.
- **Federal Judiciary Consensus:** LWVGR hosted a Federal Judiciary Forum as part of the national League consensus process. Thirty-six members attended a lively and educational discussion, guided by an expert panel of Sara Dady, Kate Cross, and Keith Syfert organized and moderated by Claire Flynn McIntyre. Our League's input will contribute to LWVUS's new position on the federal judiciary.

Outreach and Visibility

Thanks to Communications Chair Joan Sage, our presence in local media grew significantly. We also mailed 1,000 postcards encouraging civic participation, supported by a grassroots "stamp-a-thon" that collected 1,155 stamps in three weeks.

Structural Changes

Membership dues are now managed via LWWUS on a rolling basis.

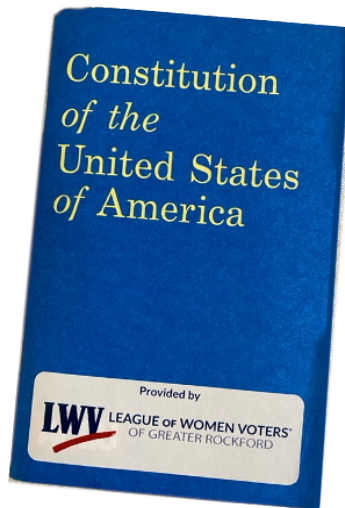
The National League in Action app was launched.

✧ Gun Violence Prevention Committee

Over the summer of 2024, our Gun Violence Prevention (GVP) committee formed a plan to develop a collaborative event for gun violence prevention. We met with Northern Illinois Center For NonProfit Excellence (NICNE) to discuss our ideas. We presented a plan to Mayor McNamara to develop community-based solutions to reduce youth gun violence. After a series of meetings and grant writing, we are excited to announce that we will host our first youth gun violence community collaborative in May!

Our group began to grow and in November we held a Zoom meeting to discuss the LWVIL GVP Position Statements. Our GVP committee partnered with Rockford Area Moms Demand Action members to review these position statements and develop consensus. Our GVP Position Statement review was submitted to LWVIL at the end of March, 2025.

We will continue to partner with other GVP focused groups in the Rockford area to learn more about advocacy, gun violence prevalence and gun violence prevention. Look for our announcements about upcoming community events that bring this issue to the forefront. Our group is always open to new members and new ideas as we work to reduce youth gun violence.

✧ Healthcare Committee

The LWVGR Healthcare Committee was revitalized July 30, 2024 to discuss whether a joint effort between LWVGR and Eliminate Racism 815's Health Action Team could be a possibility. After reviewing collaboration guidelines and missions, both groups felt a strong partnership could be built.

The initial effort of this committee was focusing on the upcoming vote for the Winnebago County Mental Health Tax referendum. Meeting efforts targeted how to get the word out to voters. This committee organized the panel and discussion of this tax along with an October Meet & Greet at Pilgrim Baptist Church. The referendum passed in the April 1, 2025 election.

We have been meeting monthly to determine next courses of action. At this time, the committee is focusing on working not only with the Winnebago Mental Health Board, but looking to find a way to assist small groups in finding/accessing grants to provide quality mental health services in our community.

✧ Immigration Committee

The immigration committee was very active this past year. We held public presentations on immigration issues in partnership with AAUW and Rockford Public Library including a “Know Your Rights” session in partnership with Dady Law Group LLC. We organized a postcard campaign in support of immigration reform for membership and the general public to local, state, and federal elected officials. We engaged in numerous calls to action by LWVIL and Illinois Coalition for Immigrant and Refugee Rights on the state and federal level regarding immigration related legislation. Locally, we organized and spoke against an effort by one City Council Alderman to remove the “Rockford – All Are Welcome” sign posted on E. State St and I-90 entrance. City Council voted unanimously to keep the sign. We are planning more public information events in the upcoming year and will continue to take action in support of the League’s position on immigration.

The League position on immigration: *Immigration policies should promote the reunification of immediate families, meet economic, business, and employment needs, and be responsive to those facing political persecution or humanitarian crises.*

We would welcome any League Member who wants to join us in this important advocacy work.

✧ Issues Committee

Thank you to all the League members who took the time to submit witness slips, call and write legislators, both national and state, to support positions important to the League’s work.

As you all know, this is how we protect voters, the democratic process, and advocate for positions such as immigration policies, improved school funding, and sane gun violence prevention laws. You will find detailed information on the work of our issues committees in each committee’s report.

We are very grateful for the LWVIL issues specialists, in particular Kim Reed (Immigration), Ann Courter (Education Funding), and Jim McGrath (Gun Violence Prevention) who kept our committee chairs apprised of upcoming legislation and statewide advocacy work. Most Issues Specialists have a Google List Serve Group that goes out to interested members statewide. If there is a topic that

interests you, please let the LWVGR Issues Committee Chairs know and they will connect you with the appropriate specialist.

In addition to the GVP update chaired by Rev. Danice Loveridge at LWVIL’s request, LWVUS requested each League in the nation to participate in a Federal Judiciary Study to establish a national position. With the help of Sara Dady, Kate Cross, and Keith Syfert as our expert panel of attorneys, LWVGR completed the consensus for the study on April 9th. Our panel provided excellent and thought-provoking information which initiated thoughtful discussion and questions from the League members in attendance. It was an educational process for all.

A special thanks goes to Sara, Kate, Keith for their leadership and to Teresa Hill, Jennifer Blaisdell for their planning skills, and the other volunteers who assisted that evening.

✧ Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)

The Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), also known as Title III of the Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA), requires states and local governments to establish local chemical emergency preparedness programs for their communities.

The Winnebago County Local Emergency Planning Committee (WCLEPC) gathers hazardous materials information from industry and other users and prepare an incident response plan approach to hazardous materials incidents. They also provide public presentations and workshops for the community.

When voters feel secure that their vote is counted accurately and without interference, they are more likely to believe in the legitimacy of the election results. Local elections authorities addressed concerns about voter fraud, vote tampering, voting machine accuracy, and more. Speakers were Lori Gummow, Winnebago County Clerk and Ryan Brauns, Rockford Board of Elections. Team leader was Elizabeth Lindquist.

"Referendum to Continue 0.5% Tax for Mental Health" at Pilgrim Baptist Church. Candidate Meet & Greet team leader was Paulette Gilbert. Panel discussion team leader was Becky Kendall. Panel moderator was Wally Haas from Transform Rockford. Co-hosted by Eliminate Racism 815, AKA, AAUW, and LWVGR.

"Our Fight, Our Future" The candidate Meet & Greet team leader was Faye Marcus, and topic team leader was Carol Bailey. The panelists included retired 17th Circuit Court in Illinois Judge Rosemary Collins, ACLU-IL Advocacy Director Khadine Bennett, Attorney Carol Bailey and ACLU Legislative Operations Associate Kelly Yue who spoke about their work around voting in jails and the importance of local offices.

"Is My Vote Safe? The Integrity of Boone County's Election System" and Candidate Meet & Greet at Belvidere North High School. Laura Bettis - Boone County Deputy Clerk addressed address common myths concerning the election process, ballot safety, and voter eligibility. Judge Rosemary Collins was the moderator. Karen Ruffner was the team leader, supported by Teresa Kruger.

Local Government hosted Five Meet & Greets in March.

Hononegah - standing room only - 42 candidates participated. Well attended and a great venue. We need more volunteers in the area and a better outreach with the school to help get high school students involved like we achieved at Harlem. This will be on our agenda to build

- relationships. Rockton-Roscoe News was our partner. Great help!
- Harlem - Lead by Carol Bailey. This was a student lead effort that was outstanding and we would like to encourage other schools to do similar activities. Very well attended. Hope we can model more events like this. The only draw back was it was only school district and Rock Valley College Trustee candidates. There were several other area races that we did not cover. We need more partners. Christine Haeggquist moderated.
- Southeast, Brooke Road - Sara Dady did an abbreviated *Know your Rights* presentation. We had 14 candidates. Not as well attended by the public. There was a school board meeting, unfortunate timing. Co-sponsored by the Immigration Committee and Brooke Road United Methodist Church. Sara Dady moderated.
- Northwest - Well-attended. Fourteen Rockford candidates were invited. Co-hosted by Alpha Kappa Alpha and Delta Sigma Theta Sororities, and the America Association of University Women (AAUW). Rhonda Robinson moderated.
- Belvidere - organized by Teresa Kruger and Tracy Rangel. Held with Belvidere North High School as partner.
- Rock Valley College Trustee Candidate Forum - LWVGR had a table, provided cookies, and some assistance for timing. Karen Ruffner helped with the table. Well-attended and the RVC students did a great job. All candidates attended.
- The Local Government Committee is a huge learning curve for me and there is room for improvement. The time it takes to gather candidate emails is astounding. I strongly discourage having multiple events on the same date and time as in this and the last election season. Goal: better cooperation with political party organizations to increase participation and email contact.

We have a spreadsheet created to help identify offices up for election and will help with future events. There were several positions in the rural areas that lacked a candidate. There is also a trend to only run as a write-in candidate. South Beloit school board only had one declared candidate. The rest of candidates were write-ins. This is a growing trend and we will study this.

All events had great news coverage and all but Belvidere was live-streamed.

There is an interest in focusing on encouraging people to run for office this year.

Observer Corps

Lights 4 Democracy Event, March 4, 2025

The Light 4 Democracy event was held March 4, 2025 at Rockford City Hall. LWV US asked all/any local Leagues to host an event as a response to the first joint address to Congress by the President. This was an event to stand up for Democracy and give all in our community an alternative to the message/actions of the current administration. Sara Dady and Teresa Hill stepped up and organized this event.

Sara Dady donated all the funds that were used for this event through her Law Office, Dady Law Group. We thank them for their generous donation.

DJ (Jose DJ-Dark) provided excellent sound and lighting, a Food Truck (Jaliscoast Rayo), poster table, postcard writing table and organizations: AAUW, Be Smart, WCCC, All of Us.

Twenty League members volunteered and helped make this event possible. Over 200 people attended the event. The Mobilize app connected us easily with LWV US organizational tools and was a great resource that we can use for future events. A video recording is available for this event. 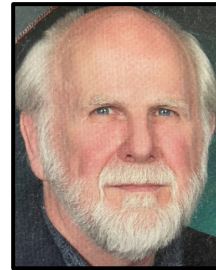

✧ Voter Services Committee

The Voter Services Committee was extremely active this fiscal year. Through the summer months the member led by Latino Voter Outreach Coordinator, Maria Mendia,

participated in every Levings Lake program, every major festival and numerous community gatherings. During the fall election cycle, the committee set up voter registrations at area high schools. Many people joined the League and became deputy registrars during this period. The idea for the Stateline High School Voter Registration Challenge was developed with Dr. Teresa Kruger and the Student Voice Club at Belvidere North High School. The school also paid for the plaques to be awarded at the end of the school year to the school with the most registered voters and the school with the highest percentage of registered voters. As of this writing we have 52 deputy registrars.

One of the biggest voter outreach innovations came at Rock Valley College with grant money utilized to create a portal dedicated to registering students at RVC. Prof. Mathew Oakes, Prof. Paulette Gilbert and others spearheaded this unique project. This portal resulted in 343 new registrations. In addition, RVC obtained permission to set up an early voting site which allowed almost 2000 people to vote.

After in-person registration ended in late September, many committee members turned their focus to the Meet & Greets and GOTV (Get Out The Vote) activities, including displaying GOVOTE815 signs and postcard writing to voters. These activities ceased for a period after the presidential election. After the new year, in-person registrations commenced until late January when the local consolidated election calendar required discontinuing in-person voter registration until after the April 1 general election.

Our biggest voter registration drives occurred during the month of April. The winners of the Stateline High School Voter Registration Challenge. Guilford had 285 registrations a new all time one day total. With 64 already registered plus 30 fall registrations that total for the school year is 379 to win one of the challenge awards. Pecatonica wins the other award for the highest percentage of eligible students registered at 87%. Currently total registrations stand at 2002 for the period July 1, 2024 to May 1, 2025.

This summer the Membership Chair, Teresa Hill and her team are joining our committee to populate several community events with an informational table rather than registration tables. We are trying this concept this summer since there are no elections for the remainder of 2025. More details to follow as we plan this project.
