VOTER REGISTRATION

To vote you must register. You must register again when you move or change your name.

Any US citizen who was born on or before November 3, 2002 may register to vote. The deadline for registering outside of the election offices is February 18, 2020. **Seventeen year olds may register and vote in this election if they are 18 on or before November 3, 2020.**

ONLINE REGISTRATION

To register **online** you must have a current Illinois driver's license or Illinois State ID. The online voter registration application website is ova.elections.il.gov. The deadline for registering online is March 1, 2020

WHAT YOU NEED TO REGISTER TO VOTE

- Two forms of identification, one must show your current address, and current name. The other just your current name.
- The last four numbers of your Social Security.
- If you are a naturalized citizen, the date and place (City & Court) of your naturalization

VOTE BY MAIL

Any registered voter may vote by mail without stating a reason. You may request an application for a ballot 90 days before the election, beginning December 18, 2019. You may request an application for a ballot online at your election office website or by calling the election office. Ballots will be mailed to you beginning 40 days before the election, February 6, 2020. The last day a ballot will be mailed to you is 5 days before the election, March 12, 2020. Ballots returned by mail must be postmarked by Election Day, March 17, 2020

GRACE PERIOD REGISTRATION AND VOTING

Grace period voting is an extension of the deadline for registration. You must have lived at your current address 30 days prior to the election. Keep in mind you must register and vote at the same time, so be prepared to vote.

Grace period registration and voting in Election Offices begins February 19, 2020.

EARLY VOTING

Early voting in all of the election offices begins February 6, 2020 and ends March 16, 2020.

ELECTION DAY SAME DAY REGISTRATION

For the 2020 Election, registration and voting will be available at all polling places.

CHECK YOUR REGISTRATION

Even if you are a registered voter, it's a good idea to confirm at ova.elections.il.gov

IN ILLINOIS YOU CANNOT VOTE ONLINE.

If you would like to avoid long lines at the polls or possible bad weather on Election Day, we *encourage* you to take advantage of Early Voting or Vote by Mail alternatives.
